

D40S Cabinet Meeting Minutes
14 February 2009 Alamogordo, NM

1. DG Kitty Callender commenced the D40S Cabinet Meeting at 11AM. Lion Georgia Qualls led the Lions Prayer. VDG Rosa Doporto led the Pledge of Allegiance.
2. DG Kitty Callender introduced our special guests PID Ray Marley, PID Don Reese, and MDCC Jeff Kriz. All attendees were asked to stand and introduce themselves. Roll Call showed all Cabinet Zone and Committee Chairs present except Lions Clarence Gausoin and Jim Jones.
3. [Negligent Cabinet Secretary (should be fired!!) forgot to include approval of previous Cabinet Meeting minutes in the agenda and hence it was not done. The minutes from the 1 November D40S Cabinet Meeting were sent out on email distribution and posted on the website. No revisions have been submitted to date.]
4. DCS/T Bryson McCool provided a D40S Financial Report which showed the itemized expenditures and deposits of the checking account, a D40S budget showing projected and to-date income and expenditures status, and a summary report showing current balances of the Ruidoso Disaster Relief Fund (LCIF), the Diabetes Awareness Fund, the Memorials Fund, the MERL Fund, and the General Fund. Also presented were a Membership, Monthly M & A Reports, and Dues Status Report for all D40S Clubs. A motion was made by PDG Ernest London to approve the financial report. The motion, which was seconded by PDG Rick Jensen, carried. This report can be found at the conclusion of these minutes.
5. Lion Chuck Galusha provided his reports a head of schedule since he was not feeling well and might have to leave early.

* Environmental Photo Contest - Two photos were submitted and presented to the audience to select the best one. The vote showed that the photo by Lorrie LaBelle was the winner. She will be presented a check for \$100 from D40S and the photo will be submitted to Lions International as a finalist from the District level.

* Lion Chuck reported that members of the NM Lions Operation KidSight Executive Committee had attended meetings on 6-7 February in Albuquerque. On 6 February, the committee received a demonstration of the new screening camera (PediaVision) which shows great promise with respect to performance and cost for the state program. On Saturday the Committee met with LCIF reps to

discuss the Committee applying for an LCIF matching grant of \$150,000. The Committee decided to apply for the grant which is currently in progress.

6. Zone Reports.

Zone 1 - Chair PDG LeRoy Rapp reported that the five clubs (Deming, Deming Wildcats, Lordsburg, Silver City, Bayard) in his zone were doing well for the most part. Silver City is in the process of getting a screening camera for their kid's screening program; meet twice a month, one meeting in the morning and the other in the evening in an attempt to increase attendance at meetings. Deming Wildcats very active with projects. Lordsburg has a new President and they hope to increase membership and activity. Deming has bought their iScreen camera and currently screening kids. Bayard is currently going through a transitional period and hopes to get back on track soon.

Zone 2 - Chair Ruth Gange. *Hatch Lions Club*: Club now has 12 members and hopes to increase membership in the future. Club is doing well and has 100% attendance at their meetings. *T or C Lions Club*: Doing well with St. Patrick's Day, T or C Fiesta, and Gun Show projects coming up. *Elephant Butte Host Lions Club*: Membership is down. Chili Cook-Off and Carp Roundup projects coming up.

Zone 3 - Chair Clarence Gaussoin - No Report.

Zone 4 - Chair Phil Marvel. All clubs in Zone 4 have been visited recently. Las Cruces Lions sell roses on Mother's Day and sell Lions coloring books as fundraisers. They work with the NM Lions Crane Foundation and provide eye glasses/exams for children. Mesilla Lions have an annual Car Show and set out 4500 luminaries at Christmas as fundraisers. They provide eye exams and glasses for needy folks and administer to a park playground for Mesilla children. Anthony Lions hold monthly bingo sessions and host a Las Vegas Night for fundraising. They provide eye exams and glasses for needy kids in the Gadsden School District.

Zone 5 - Chair Chuck Maly reported the three Clubs in his Zone (Ruidoso Evening, Ruidoso Noon, and Capitan Smokey Bear) are active and doing well. The *Ruidoso Evenings* fundraisers are flags, Rose Sale, Magic Show, and Gun Show with service projects such as collecting glasses, scholarships, eye exams and glasses for needy people. Recent fundraisers for the *Capitan Smokey Bear* Lions include lunches for a bridge tournament and German Potato Soup booth at Oktoberfest and a major service project at Camp Sierra Blanca where residents are using the Crane Reading Program installed by the club and a book tape project where residents can record books for their children. The *Ruidoso Noon* Lions have been quite busy with their signature Operation KidSight project as well as buying eye exams and glasses for needy folks, highway cleanup, assisting Santa's Helpers, scholarships to name a few.

Major fundraisers are an annual Crafts, Guns, and Collectibles Show, Antique Show, and Chili Cook-Off.

Zone 6 - Chair Jeanette Lang reported all seven clubs are doing fine. Tularosa - Sec. Betty Woods was ill for a couple of months. She is doing her reports this week. The club is doing their Wild Feed Night Feb 26, and they are also coming to Earth Day. Cloudcroft is doing a lot as they are setting up a golf tournament and have helped with KidSight and Solar Cars for the Cloudcroft Elementary School for Earth Day. Alamogordo Evening Lions are holding their Gun Shows and their Memorial Run +Shine in April, County Fair in August and taking in new members. High Rolls Club is getting new Lions and have been doing the Crane Reading Program with great results. They also help with KidSight for High Rolls Elementary School, Adopt -A -Mile, and the Apple and Cherry Festivals. Alamogordo Breakfast Lions Club membership still climbing and activities never ending. KidSight, Earth Day, Trinity Sight Breakfast feed twice a year, Adopt-A -Mile, Hearing Aid Program, County Fair in August, Heath Fair for Diabetes Awareness, deliver meals on Christmas and New Years, Christmas Gifts for Kids at C.O.P.E, Angel Tree, and Food for Families of D.O.H., and some club visitations. Alamogordo Downtown Club is doing fine. Donating clothes to people in need. Alamogordo Noon Club taken in some new members . Doing there Flags for the Year helps support KidSight and scholarships. All the Clubs help in providing eye exams and glasses for needy folks in the community.

Zone 7 - Chair Lion Melissa Washburn. A Zone Meeting was held in Artesia NM in January 2009. There was representation from all three clubs: Carlsbad Downtown, Carlsbad Heights, and Artesia Downtown, with 7 members present. All three clubs seem to be in great shape with new membership in each. Fund raisers have been beneficial for all of them and preparation is being made by all three clubs for the Lions eye van. Carlsbad Clubs will host the van at a health fair March 14, 2009, and then it will travel to Artesia for their health fair April 25, 2009. Plans are being made for all these Clubs to have the eye camera on sight at the health fairs to screen home schooled children. Club visits are being arranged, with limited time left in this term, I hope to get them finished by April 1. A second Zone Meeting will be hosted in Carlsbad sometime in March.

Zone 8 - Chair Gemma Ferguson. The Zone has two new clubs, New Vision and Save Our Youth Mariachi, both in Roswell. I haven't had a zone meeting yet, but will schedule it in March. I have visited all but Roswell Mid-Day and will visit them soon. All the clubs are active and proud to be a part of this dynamic organization.

Zone 9 - Chair PDG Ernest London reported the clubs (Eunice, Hobbs Downtown, Hobbs Evening, Lovington, Tatum) in his zone are also doing well with membership increasing with Hobbs Downtown at a +8 in membership growth for the year. The

Clubs in this zone have raised the money to buy a screening camera and start Operation KidSight.

7. Committee Reports.

Sight Conservation - Chair Phil Marvel announced the Lions Club International Eye Donor Awareness Month is March. An article on the collection and recycling of used eye glasses has been posted in the latest Lions Roar. Sight First II is still active and needs support.

* **UNM Hospital Project** - MDCC Jeff Kriz gave a report on the UNM Hospital project for Lions to raise three million dollars which will result in Lions getting the Lions name and logo on the new building. The building will house a treatment, research, and training facility.

LCIF - Chair Georgia Qualls provided a report on some of the latest humanitarian and disaster relief accomplishments around the world made possible by LCIF grants including that for the wildfires in Australia.

Diabetes Awareness - Chair Jeanette Lang No Report.

Information Technology - Chair Bryson McCool announced he will not be the MD40 Info Tech chair as of 1 July 2009. Anyone interested in the job can check the job description in the latest Roar.

Hearing and Speech - Chair Clarence Gaussoin DG Kitty read a letter from Lion Clarence stating the Hearing Aid Recycling Center will be closing.

Women's Development - Chair Melissa Washburn. The latest from LCI with W/I is a new program to bring in the children of family Lions. Alfa - through age 3, Beta 4yrs to 7yrs, and Omega Cubs 8 yrs to 12 yrs. LCI is trying to get entire families involved and given the 12 yr old age limit this is a way to recognize our future Lions. Manuals, patches, and certificates of participation are being put together this year, and these Cubs are allowed to participate in Lions meetings by carrying in flags, invocations, and working Lion projects. Stats available report that women have been members since 1987, currently there are 106 Women District Governors worldwide, and currently 6,698 women club presidents who make up 14.4% of all club presidents worldwide. As for Symposium, a venue is secure at Hotel Ruidoso, and registrations are out, we are looking forward to a wonderful Symposium this year We have run into a bit of a snag with the BBQ, as it is against the law to cook outside in Ruidoso right now given the drought situations. With that in mind, if that is still the case in April, we then will opt to have a sub sandwich frenzie after the symposium. Cost of Symposium remains \$30 per participants, the Buttery from Capitan will cater the lunch, and we plan on having a couple of wonderful guest speakers, one of which is a New Mexico native and new Lion. I would encourage all Lions to attend and bring a friend.

Leadership - Chair PDG Rick Jensen reported the 10 January 2009 training went well with good attendance. He switched gears and talked about the proposed MD40 Constitution changes that have been provided to date for his review. The proposed changes ask to reduce the amount specified for the Roar from \$5 to \$3 and provide the \$2 to the Districts for their MERL programs. The other change is to split the \$2.50 specified for the MD40 MERL Program between MD40 and the Districts. After a loooong debate, it was decided to revise the proposal to eliminate the second part about splitting the MERL funds. It was also mentioned that there is MERL money at MD40 and if you are working on a MERL mission, expenditures can be reimbursed out of that fund.

8. Lion Jeanette Lang reported there is a contest to come up with a NM Lions KidSight pin and patch. If anyone would like to enter, please contact Lions Chuck Galusha or Bryson McCool.
9. PID Ray Marley provided a report on the upcoming State Convention. The Farmington Chamber of Commerce has provided info about Farmington to all Clubs. Registration Forms and other Convention information are provided on the Website and in the Roar. Lion Ray encouraged all to get their registrations in early. A block of 70 rooms have been blocked for Convention attendees.
10. DG Kitty Callender presented Lions Jim and Bettie Brannon with a patch from LCI for sponsoring the new Roswell Mariachi Save Our Youth Lions Club. DG Kitty then presented PDG Jim Brannon with the International 100% DG Award.
11. PID Ray Marley gave a short report on the TTT Program. Six states are involved in this club rejuvenation program and there will be an update in the near future. He suggested Lions read a book, "Our Iceberg Is Melting," which provides some insight on problems facing Lionism today.
12. The raffles were held with Lions winning some nice prizes. \$24.35 was collected in fines and \$82 was gained from the raffle.
13. DG Kitty Callender adjourned the meeting.
