

## D40S Cabinet Meeting

1 November 2008

Ruidoso, NM

### ***Zone Chair Meeting Prior To Cabinet Meeting***

1. DG Kitty Callender opened the Zone Chair Meeting at 10AM. Attending Zone Chairs were: 1 - PDG LeRoy Rapp; 2 - Lion Ruth Gange; 3 - Lion Clarence Gaussoin; 4 - Lion Phil Marvel; 5 - Lion Chuck Maly; 6 - Jeanette Lang; 9 - PDG Ernest London.

2. DG Kitty Callender commended Zone Chairs for their efforts and asked for input to problem areas.

\* Club Dues Not being Paid Promptly - One excuse was a club may only be checking the PO box every couple of weeks or more and therefore can't be prompt paying their bills. Another reason is there may be some problem with club Secretaries and Treasurers realizing that paying the dues promptly is their responsibility. It was mentioned that at this time, there were only 7 clubs out of 35 that had not paid their MD40/District dues which is pretty good considering the due date was 15 October.

\* Membership - DG Kitty Callender was very encouraged that with the addition of the two new Roswell clubs, this is the first time in several years where D40S membership growth is positive. She commended the efforts of PDG Jim and Lion Bettie Brannon and MDCC Jeff Kriz for their efforts in getting the new clubs started. Zone Chair Ruth Gange related that she has been providing membership packets of information and applications to each Lion who attends her zone meetings.

\* Club Officer Training & Orientation - DG Kitty Callender reiterated the importance of club officer training and member orientation. It is imperative that all clubs (especially the club secretary) be computer literate and able to send reports electronically. International is now calling for all reports to be filed electronically. Monthly Club Activity reports also need to be filed electronically with the Cabinet S/T. Orientation should be a monthly club activity. There is an Orientation Guide that covers all aspects of Lionism from International to the club level on the NM Lions Website under training. This is an excellent handbook to use for club orientation.

\* DG's Newsletter - Lion Kitty Callender asked for everyone to please read her Newsletter each month. She said it will provide some useful information on what is going on in D40S and give some insights into the goals she would like to achieve this year.

3. DG Kitty Callender gave a rundown on the new 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG position that will be put into effect starting for the 2009-2010 year. Thus when do the nomination in February 2009 of the 1<sup>st</sup> VDG, nomination of a 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG will also occur.
4. DG Kitty Callender again thanked the Zone Chairs for their efforts and adjourned the meeting at 10:40AM.

### ***D40S Cabinet Meeting***

1. DG Kitty Callender commenced the D40S Cabinet Meeting at 10AM. Lion Georgia Qualls led the Lions Prayer. VDG Rosa Doportto led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by all reciting the Lions Pledge.
2. DG Kitty Callender asked for all attendees to stand and introduce themselves. Special guests were PID Ray Marley, MDCC Jeff Kriz, PDG Mary Jane Shannon, and PDG Lee Boyd Montgomery.
3. DCS/T Bryson McCool announced the minutes from the 9 August 2008 D40S Cabinet Meeting had been sent out on email distribution and posted on the website. He asked if there were any corrections or additions. None were noted. A motion by PDG Ernest London was made to approve the minutes as posted. Lion Phil Marvel seconded the motion which carried.
4. DCS/T Bryson McCool provided a D40S Financial Report which showed the itemized expenditures and deposits of the checking account, a D40S budget showing projected and to-date income and expenditures status, and a summary report showing current balances of the Ruidoso Disaster Relief Fund (LCIF), the Diabetes Awareness Fund, the Memorials Fund, the MERL Fund, and the General Fund. Also presented were a Membership, Monthly M & A Reports, and Dues Status Report for all D40S Clubs. This report can be found at the conclusion of these minutes.
5. Zone Reports.

**Zone 1** - Chair PDG LeRoy Rapp reported that the five clubs (Deming, Deming Wildcats, Lordsburg, Silver City, Bayard) in his zone were doing well. He thanked DG Kitty Callender for helping to get things straightened out in Lordsburg and they are now on track and trying to increase membership. The Deming Lions are in the process of buying an iScreen camera and starting the Operation KidSight Program in that area of the state.

**Zone 2** - Chair Ruth Gange. *Hatch Lions Club*: I visited with the Hatch Lions Club on October 13th and had a most enjoyable visit. This club orders their lunch by phone ahead of time, so when they arrive their lunch is ready, and they can get right down to business. This is a fun club, but they do get all their business done taken care of at the same time. They have several projects in the works and are working on the

Health Fair with Ben Archer. I talked to them about membership and they have several prospects they are working on, one of whom was a visitor. They hold a raffle with the money going to a scholarship. I took literature for them to give to prospective members as well as an application for each of them to carry with them. One member showed her application proudly that she carries with her at all times. ***T or C Lions Club:*** Even though this club does not hold regular meetings they are one of the busiest clubs I know. Anytime I talk with either Lions Jim or Bettie, they are working on some project either as a Lions project or in conjunction with another organization. Their current project is the Annual Car Show to be held at the New Mexico Veteran's Home on November 8<sup>th</sup>. I attended a meeting and this will be a huge affair, with many cars, prizes, raffles and vendors. A lot of planning has gone in to this and it promises to be a huge success. They are already planning Christmas activities whereby boxes of food are distributed and of course, Santa and Mrs. Santa will be present to talk to the kids and hand out gifts. ***Elephant Butte Host Lions Club:*** The annual Carp Roundup was a big success, even though the attendance was only 173 participants, and due to sudden cold water phenomena, very few fish were caught it was a day of fun and lots of prizes. They are working towards Christmas activities; giving out gifts to names from Christmas trees at the banks and helping the T or C Lions Club with the Sierra Santa's. The EB Lions give out fruit and candy to the kids, and help load boxes of food into cars, and wherever needed. We are looking forward to 2009 and lots more projects.

**Zone 3** - Chair Clarence Gaussoin reported that the three clubs (Las Cruces de Noche, Las Cruces Sunrise, La Mesa) are very active and doing well. All are up to date with respect to International and MD40/D40S dues.

**Zone 4** - Chair Phil Marvel. All clubs in Zone 4 (Anthony, Las Cruces Noon, Mesilla) were all visited and interviewed according to report. All clubs are meeting and are doing well. All are doing fundraising and also working on their club projects. All clubs were encouraged to participate from local to international. Las Cruces Lions Club and Los Leones de Mesilla Lions Club are increasing in membership. Some issues arose and are being dealt with and hopefully be resolved soon.

**Zone 5** - Chair Chuck Maly reported the three Clubs in his Zone (Ruidoso Evening, Ruidoso Noon, and Capitan Smokey Bear) are active and doing well. The *Ruidoso Evenings* fundraisers are flags, Rose Sale, Magic Show, and Gun Show with service projects such as collecting glasses, scholarships, eye exams and glasses for needy people. Recent fundraisers for the *Capitan Smokey Bear* Lions include lunches for a bridge tournament and German Potato Soup booth at Oktoberfest and a major service project at Camp Sierra Blanca where residents are using the Crane Reading Program installed by the club and a book tape project where residents can record books for their children. The *Ruidoso Noon* Lions have been quite busy with their

signature Operation KidSight project as well as buying eye exams and glasses for needy folks, highway cleanup, assisting Santa's Helpers, scholarships to name a few. Major fundraisers are an annual Crafts, Guns, and Collectibles Show, Antique Show, and Chili Cook-Off.

**Zone 6** - Chair Jeanette Lang reported the clubs in her zone (Alamogordo Breakfast, Alamogordo Downtown, Alamogordo Evening, Alamogordo Noon, Tularosa, High Rolls, and Cloudcroft) are doing well with a net gain of five new Lions. A Zone Meeting was held 27 October with six of the seven clubs in attendance. Alamogordo Downtown Lions are looking for a new place to meet.

**Zone 7** - Lion Melissa Washburn (reporting for Zone Chair Ronnie Jackson) that the three clubs (Artesia Downtown, Carlsbad Heights, and Carlsbad Downtown) are doing quite well. Carlsbad Downtown and Artesia Downtown have gone in together to purchase an iScreen camera. Both clubs have been screening kids in their communities. The Carlsbad Downtown Lions conducted their Haunted House on Halloween with more than 700 kids going through in three hours. The Carlsbad Heights are busy getting ready for the Christmas on the Pecos fundraiser.

**Zone 8** - Chair Gemma Ferguson. The Zone (Hagerman, Roswell Downtown, Roswell Midday) has already gained a new club in Roswell, the Soy Mariachi Club (sponsored by the T or C Lions) that had its charter lunch last Saturday. There will be another new club in Roswell (sponsored by Carlsbad Downtown) that will be chartered by the end of the year. The original clubs are doing fine. DG Kitty helped the Roswell Midday club to get their M reports caught up. The Roswell Downtown club just completed their major service project of the year by furnishing hamburgers to the mentally challenged at the Eastern NM State Fair. I will be helping Hagerman with their M reports current.

**Zone 9** - Chair PDG Ernest London reported the clubs (Eunice, Hobbs Downtown, Hobbs Evening, Lovington, Tatum) in his zone are also doing well. Two zone meetings have been held on 28 August 2008 and 23 October 2008 with good attendance. At the most recent meeting, the Lea County Clubs have decided to raise the money to buy an iScreen camera and start Operation KidSight. The zone has seen a net increase in membership of six. There is also a chance the Jal Lions Club can be brought back.

## 6. Committee Reports.

**Sight Conservation** - Chair Phil Marvel announced the Operation KidSight project in the District is expanding with new programs starting up. He gave a rundown on the remote camera system that links Las Cruces and UNM Hospital in Albuquerque. Used glasses collection in the District is doing well in the District.

**LCIF** - Chair Georgia Qualls provided a report on some of the latest humanitarian and disaster relief accomplishments around the world made possible by LCIF grants including the one recently given for the Ruidoso flood.

**Diabetes Awareness** - Chair Jeanette Lang described Jump Rope Program, a new project the Alamogordo Breakfast Lions have started in their community. The intent of the Jump Rope Program is to get children involved in physical activity. It is intended to be conducted as a Diabetes Awareness program targeting elementary schools. Primarily, 3rd through 5th grades are involved. For implementation, it requires a nurse, teacher, or someone from the PE staff who will consent to administering the school side of the program. The vision/long range goal of the program is to have Lions Clubs statewide sponsor Jump Rope Teams/Clubs with the goal of creating enough teams to be able to promote city, county, region, and state-wide competitions. In many parts of the country, Jump Rope is so popular it could support setting up regional or national competitions. There is money in the D40S Diabetes Awareness Fund to help clubs buy the jump ropes for the kids. Another program has to do with buying sets of diabetes books (that provide information about every aspect of diabetes) for libraries. Sets cost about \$90 each.

**Information Technology** - Chair Bryson McCool announced that if anyone is having a problem downloading the Roar or DG Newsletter, they should try upgrading their version of Adobe Reader. Lion Bryson commended all the clubs that have been sending in articles and pictures for the Lions Roar. He asked that clubs continue to do so as it is great way to report on what your club is doing which may provide some project ideas for other clubs.

**Hearing and Speech** - Chair Clarence Gaussoin announced that only three donations have come in to support providing hearing aids for the needy in NM. He announced that without contributions to the Foundation, he will be unable to continue giving hearing aids to folks who really need them but cannot afford it. He asked Clubs to please reconsider and support this important project.

**Women's Development** - Chair Melissa Washburn announced the 2009 Women's Symposium will occur 4 April 2009 in Ruidoso. Letters will be going out soon to provide all of the details. This is a great event for all Lions and provides some good training and information.

**Environmental & Peace Poster** - Chair Jeanette reported the Peace Poster Contest posters are due to DG Kitty Callender by 15 November. Environmental Photo Contest pictures are due to Chair Chuck Galusha by 15 January 2009.

**Constitution & By Laws** - Any proposals to change the MD40 Constitution must be submitted to PDG Jim Jones no later than 1 February 2008.

**Leadership** - Chair PDG Rick Jensen reported that he has published several leadership articles in the Lions Roar and he hoped everyone had read them. He was stressing the importance of orientation which can be accomplished through mini-conferences if the clubs survey their members and find they need them.

**Tail Twister** - DG Kitty announced that due to health reasons, PDG will have to resign as Cabinet Tail Twister. We need to have a volunteer to fill the position. Lion Mark Jones stepped up and was a very active Tail Twister for this meeting.

7. PDG Jim Brannon gave a report about the new Clubs in Roswell: Roswell Mariachi and Roswell New Vision. The New Vision Club meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Thursdays of each month at 7AM.
8. DG Kitty Callender announced that starting in the 2009-2010 year, there will be a 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG position. Nominees for the 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG positions will be selected at the Cabinet Meeting in February as per the process required for a conditional District.
9. DG Kitty Callender announced that drivers for the NMLEF Screening Van are needed from D40S. The only driver currently in D40S is Lion Franklin McKay. If anyone is interested, please contact NMLEF President Tom Himrod.
10. DG Kitty Callender provided a very moving video, Everyday Heroes. During the video, International President Al Brandel informed Lions they are indeed everyday heroes who are making differences in their communities around the world.
11. Several awards were presented by DG Kitty Callender.
  - \* PDG Jim Brannon was presented a "Dime Dozen Club" plaque designating his PDG status.
  - \* PDG Rick and Claudia Jensen were presented a plaque commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the High Rolls/Mountain Park Lions Club.
  - \* PDG Jim and Bettie Brannon were each presented the International President Commendation Award for their efforts to get new clubs started in Roswell.
  - \* Lion Bryson McCool was awarded the International President Commendation Award.
12. PID Ray Marley provided a report on the upcoming State Convention. Hospitality rooms should be coordinated with the host motel. Advertising is available in the Convention booklet. There will be a golf tournament at the Riverside Golf Course. The Memorial Service will be done differently with a video shown featuring a picture and words about each deceased Lion. There will be more information presented at the MD40 Council Meeting.
13. The next Special Olympics will occur on 22 November 2008 at the Corbett Center in Las Cruces. All Lions are encouraged to attend and participate.

14. Lion Phil Marvel announced that he will be a candidate for D40S 1<sup>st</sup> VDG for 2009-2010

15. Lions Phil Marvel, Renee Carrasco, and Clarence Gaussoin won the raffle prizes. PID Ray Marley won "half the pot" raffle which he donated back to D40S.

16. DG Kitty Callender adjourned the meeting.
