

MD40 Council Meeting
MD40 Convention 3-4 May 2008
Hobbs, NM

1. The 4th 2007-08 MD40 Council Meeting was called to order by MDCC Bob Callender. PID Don Reese led the Pledge of Allegiance and VDG 40N Chuck Easton led the Lions Prayer.
2. MDCC Bob Callender welcomed all the attending Lions and introduced ID Russell Sarver and the front table. He then introduced Hobbs' Mayor Joe Calderon who gave a very eloquent welcome speech to MD40 Lions.
3. MDCC Bob Callender provided his opening remarks where he reminded all the importance of setting goals and achieving them. He also mentioned the importance of always wearing your Lions Pin.
4. Due to time constraints, MDC S/T Bryson McCool was not able to present a detailed Treasurer's and Membership Report but it can be found at the end of these minutes. The Council approved the Treasurer's Report.
5. MDCC Bob Callender introduced Leader Dog Guest Speaker Wanda Scroggins. Ms. Scroggins provided a most enlightening and informative program on her leader dog, Gibson, her experiences as a blind individual, and her feelings about being a Lion. She also described her new GPS system that gives her even more freedom. She reported that there are 109 Leader Dogs in NM. She asked for NM Lions to please support Leader Dog.
6. **NM Lions Eye Bank Report** - President Manny Rodriguez provided a report which showed the Eye Bank doing great under the great directorship of Lion Lori Stampley.
7. **Special Olympics**. Report provided by Committee Chair PID Gordon Post who thanked all for participating in the past events. Dates for 2008 are as follows: Albuquerque, May 31; Farmington, August 16; and Las Cruces, November 22. PID Gordon encouraged Lions to come out and attend one of these events to experience a very rewarding event.
8. **NM Lions Band Foundation** - President Lee Boyd Montgomery reported that the Band Foundation will conduct an EXPO fundraiser in September that will be a multi-prize raffle with first prize a large TV with surround sound. The overhead this year will be reduced significantly to ensure a profit is realized. He also mentioned that Lion Phil Marvel has initiated a fundraiser where the Foundation can realize funds from people shopping at Albertsons food stores. President Lee Boyd then identified the the recently elected Foundation officers and Board members for 2008-09.
9. **NM Lions Eye Foundation** - President Jeff Kriz identified the new Foundation officers and Board members for 2008-09. He commended Lions Rita and Juan Lucero for being the Van drivers this last year. He also reviewed the proposed UNM Hospital project that NM Lions can support.
10. **NM Lions Operation KidSight**. Lion Bryson McCool provided a status report on the NM Lions Operation KidSight Project. The Taos Lions have worked with the Portales Lions to start the KidSight project in their community who are in the process of buying their

camera. Over 3000 kids have been screened since September 2007 by the Taos, Alamogordo Breakfast, and Ruidoso Noon Lions.

11. **NM Lions Crane Reading Foundation** - Lion Allen Crane reported that the Foundation's reading program in their Reading Lab at the Dream Center in Las Cruces will have 8 teachers this summer. Each child in the summer classes will be given an eye exam. VDG Kitty Callender provided a report on the Crane Reading Program at Ft. Stanton where drug abusers are learning to read and providing children's book tapes for their children. PDG Rick Jensen related that the Crane Reading Program has been instituted in the school there and five kids, who were doing poorly, made an astounding jump in reading capability. Lion Allen Crane announced that the NM Lions Crane Reading Foundation will begin to hold Board Meetings every two months.
12. **NM Lions Survivor Camp** - VDG Kitty Callender explained to all what the Camp is. She noted that due to the fact the Director of the Camp for two years had gotten a job somewhere else and would not be available this summer, there would not be camp this year. The Las Cruces Sunrise Lions, primary sponsors of the Camp, are trying to raise funds to sponsor a director for next summer. Donations are welcome from NM Lions Clubs to the Las Cruces Sunrise Lions for the Camp.
13. **Hearing Aid Repair/Recycling Center** - Lion Clarence reported on needy folks that have requested and received repaired hearing aids. He also reported on folks who have requested assistance. NM Lions Clubs and MD40 have donated \$1660 to assist in Center costs. The Rexton Hearing Aid Company are donating hearing aids to the company.
14. **Campaign SightFirst II** - PDG Bob Jones announced that over \$163M has been donated to CSFII worldwide. MD40 has donated/pledged \$47,610 to date. 48% of MD40 Clubs have contributed. The Farmington Evening Lions are MD40's only Model Club. He reminded all that contributions can be for Melvin Jones Fellow Awards.
15. **2nd Session:** MDC S/T Bryson McCool reported that the minutes from the MD40 Council Meeting on 16 February 2008 had been emailed to everyone and were posted on the Website. DG Tom Himrod made a motion to accept the minutes as posted. The motion was seconded by DG Jim Brannon, and hence carried.
16. MDCC Bob Callender asked that the Convention 1st Timers stand and be recognized.
17. DG40N Tom Himrod provided his comments. He said it had been a great year and he commended all the folks who worked so hard to make it so. He said that there is a very good chance of new Clubs in Clayton and Eldorado. PID Jack Ferguson will be coming to Albuquerque soon to help develop some more new Clubs. Santa Fe Capital City Lions are sponsoring a very successful Leo Club. DG Tom thanked his wife Lion Rose for all her support.
18. DG40S Jim Brannon commended those Lions who are attending their first Convention. He said he has thoroughly enjoyed the vitiations he has made to the D40S Clubs and is impressed with everything they are doing to improve their communities. He said PID Jack Ferguson will be coming 27-29 May and they will meet in Artesia and try to start a new Club

in the southeastern part of the state. He reminded all of the NM Lions Museum and Hall of Fame and items are needed for display.

19. **Past District Governor's Association** – President Don Reese announced the Association had met Thursday night and elected officers for 2008-09: President – Manny Rodriguez; VP – Rick Jensen; Sec./Treas.- Ernest London.
20. **Leadership Committee** – PID Ray Marley gave a report on the one-day training sessions that took place in Albuquerque, Clovis, Las Vegas, Artesia, and Las Cruces during March 2008. There was excellent attendance (67 not including presenters) with many new Lions attending. He is evaluating the comments from the attendees to see what is wanted next year and how it can be made better. He will provide a recommendation report at the August MD40 Council. DG40N Tom Himrod reminded all that presenters are eligible for mileage. Just get your name and mileage to MDS/T Bryson.
21. **Membership Committee** – No report.
22. **Extension Committee** – No report.
23. **Retention Committee** – Lion Gemma Ferguson thanked PDG Bob Jones for the fantastic job he has done in the north.
24. **Women's Initiative** – Lion Melissa Washburn reported that the 2nd Women's Symposium was a great experience, everyone had a great time, and PID Beverly Roberts was a great guest speaker. She has provided a questionnaire to attendees to obtain feedback to make the Symposium even better next year.
25. **Constitution & By-Laws Committee** – PDG Vic Lyon reported the one Constitution & By-Laws change has been submitted. The proposed change is to move the Convention registration close time on Saturday from 5PM to Noon. This will allow voting to take place Saturday afternoon instead of being restricted to Sunday morning. The proposed change will be voted on tomorrow morning.
26. **Diabetes Awareness** – Juan Lucero reported there will be Diabetes Bike Run coming up soon and information on it is forthcoming. Work is being done on the summer Diabetes Camp with emphasis on increasing participation over last year.
27. **Protocol & International Relations** – PID Gordon Post informed all he has copies of the correct protocol for when a dignitary visits a Club or other meeting.
28. **International Convention** – Chairperson PDG Mary Jane Shannon announced that the International Convention, which will occur 23-27 June 2008 in Bangkok, Thailand, will have only one MD40 Lion attending.
29. **LCIF** – No report.
30. **Leader Dog** – Chairperson Melissa Washburn reminded all Clubs that they need to get their Members involved in supporting Leader Dog.
31. **USA/Canada Forum** – Lion Mary Jean Reese announced that for Lions who are going to the Forum in Saskatchewan, they must get a passport.

32. **Leo Clubs** - Lion Tom Himrod announced the ATC Leo Club (sponsored by the Santa Fe Capital City Lions) is doing well and are seven members strong headed up by the young lady that was an exchange student to Japan last year. One of their projects is they are helping out with the local animal shelter.
33. Lion John Chess made a presentation on a project that his club is working jointly with a Lions Club in Peru to help provide eye exams, glasses and surgery to impoverished folks deep in the jungles. The Silver City Lions Clubs have already raised \$24,000 and are asking MD40 Lions Clubs to join in and help. Raised funds will be matched by a LCIF grant.
34. **Lions Opportunities For Youth** - Lion Miriam Stucker reported that we had an exchange student (who has studied Japanese for ten years) to Japan last year. She worked with translating for other students. She helped form the new Leo Club in Santa Fe. There was another student who wished to go to Spain but she never applied. Students must be able to speak the language of the country they wish to visit.
35. **Website/Info Technology** - Lion Bryson McCool again requested that Clubs be sure to provide articles and photos about their Clubs for the Lions Roar as it is important for Clubs all over the world to see what NM Lions are doing. He commended Lions for the great articles they have been providing. Roar comes out on the 15th each month so get articles in no later than the 15th. He also asked that if anyone is not on the Distribution List to please email him and he will add their names.
36. **State Convention** - Lion Mary Marley gave a report on the upcoming State Convention in Farmington on 28-30 May 2009. The NM Lions Band will be there. She described all the tourist attractions in the area.
37. **3rd Session.** MD40 Certificates were given to PID Gordon Post - Special Olympics; PID Ray Marley - Leadership; Melissa Washburn - Leader Dog; and PDGs Veta and Ernest London.
38. Voting took place on the proposed Constitution change and the 2008-09 MDCC position. The Constitution change passed 49 for and 9 against. PDG Jeff Kriz was elected 41 for and 17 abstaining.
39. Alamogordo Breakfast and Roswell Downtown Lions made presentations to have the 2010 Convention in Alamogordo and Roswell respectively. The vote was held and the count showed a tie. MDCC Bob Callender asked each of the delegations to write down a number between one and ten which was compared to a number he had written. Alamogordo Breakfast Lions were closest to his number and thus Alamogordo will be the location of the 2010 MD40 Convention.
40. The meeting was adjourned.

*ARTICLE XI DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S CABINET
