TTT Request for Images/Video

The Transfusion-Transition-Transformation (TTT) team consisting of Lions from Alberta Canada, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming are updating the training tool developed some time ago.

A professional screen writer that is a Hawaii Lion is doing the upgrading. His group wants to have visual material to include and has provided information as shown below on the quality of Video/photos they need.

New Mexico Lions are requested to review and submit information for consideration to be included in the updated tool.

Send information to PDG Jeff Kriz or PID Ray Marley.

Instructions on what is desired:

Type of footage/photos: Anything & Everything that pertains to New Mexico Lions activities. The more we have to work from, the easier it will be to make this really good. Send it all to us and we'll figure out what works and what doesn't within the context of the subject.

VIDEO: All new video should be shot in "widescreen" or "16:9 aspect ratio" settings on the video cameras. It won't matter if they're shooting in "high definition" or "standard definition" as long as the aspect ratio is set to "widescreen" or "16:9". Anyone who has a camera can make those adjustments on their camera menu in a matter of seconds. If we're dealing with video that has already been shot that is NOT in the proper aspect ratio, that's OK, but, it will require further cropping & editing work on our end. So, it better be good or extremely valuable to the effort to warrant the extra time.

How should the video be sent to me? The absolute BEST way is to send us the original tape, disc, or memory card that came directly from the camera it was shot on. We can work with ALL formats on this end, so sending us the original camera media will give us the absolute best results. We can return that media to the owners once we're done. If they no longer have the original camera media, or, their camcorder only has an internal memory hard-drive that can't be removed: Transfer the video footage to an MP4 or AVI file of the highest possible megabyte quality and burn it to a DVD as an MP4 or AVI file ONLY - - NOT a DVD file (such as Windows Media).

PHOTOS: All still photos should be saved as high-quality JPEG or TIFF files (at least 300kb size or higher) and sent to me on a CD or DVD. Hundreds of photos can be saved to one disc.

IMPORTANT: All media sent, video or photo, needs to be properly labeled to tell us what we're looking at. In other words, "Installation ceremony at Whatever Lions Club, February 19, 2010", or, "Highway cleaning service project of Acme Lions Club, March 4, 2010".

Anything that might be obtained from a local TV station, such as coverage of a Lions event, should be sent to us on a BETA SP tape. The TV station can do this for you if they still have the footage available. If they need the tape returned, we can do that.

Taos Lions Club Celebrates Education Day

The Taos Lions Club hosted its first "Education Day" on Thursday March 18th in the honor of Ernest Martinez, of Tio Vivi fame.

Martinez found the famous carousel (Officially a flying Jenny), on a farm in one of the local Taos communities in 1930 and talked the Lions Club into purchasing it and restoring it for enjoyment at the annual Taos Fiesta, held each July in the Town's Historic Plaza. The carousel had been left by the side of a road, stuck in mud, more that 100 years ago and taken by a local Penasco resident to a garage. where it remained until Martinez recognized its value of offering rides (currently free to all children) at the Taos Fiesta.

The Lions club officially named their scholarship at the March 18th meeting, which coincidentally happened to be the 100th birthday of Rose Martinez, the wife of Martinez, which the club also officially celebrated.

Taos historians and Martinez family member in attendance retold the story of finding the machine in terrible condition and working for a number of years to restore it to it's original condition.

Taos Lions Club President, MIke Dobbs, presented a plaque recognizing the naming of the scholarship to Emillo De Herrera the great-grandson of Eneresto. Also presence along with Rose Martinez were three of their daughters, and one grand daughter.

Mike Dobbs also announced that one of the family members will be a regular member of their scholarship selection committee, chaired by Lion Dave Danforth, the clubs secretary.

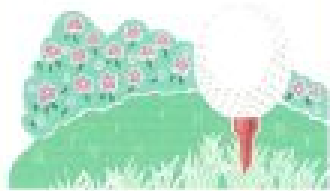

Application to attend the camp is open to International youth, male and female, ages 16-18. Applicants must be able to converse in English and be recommended by a Lions Club in their country.



LOOKING FOR AN INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE WITHOUT HAVING TO FLY?

Colorado Lions need our help to host youth from other countries, ages 16 – 18. The youth will arrive to stay with a host family for two weeks before attending camp at the Colorado Lions Camp. The camp in Woodland Park, Colorado runs from August 15 – 21, 2010. After camp, they would return to your home so they can say goodbye before they fly home. The students need transportation to and from the Albuquerque Airport and to and from camp.

A couple of families might consider co-hosting if that is more manageable. At this time, we have three families recommended by Rio Grande Lions, one from Carlsbad and one from Santa Fe.

They will arrive either July 31 or August 1 and return August 22 or 23. Transportation is needed to and from the airport and to and from the Colorado Camp. The Himrods may be able to help with transportation.
