Being a Lion, we all see a need and want to help fill it. However, when it happens to us, we can be left feeling inadequate, especially when it is a loved one that is sick and needs our help, and we are hours away.

On December 15, 2023, I received a call that is every parent's fear. My son, who travels from Albuquerque to Gallup for work, became gravely ill in the middle of the night. He had to be taken to the hospital by ambulance. He called me from the hospital to let me know what was going on and to ask what he should do. As it turned out, he had pneumonia and was very ill, but not ill enough to be kept in the hospital.

Since he was brought to the hospital in an ambulance, he had no transportation to get back to his motel. He was too sick to walk and it was very early in the morning so finding a ride would be difficult. He had spent all night in the ER and needed help.

I contacted District Governor Ed DeArmond, who lives in Gallup, and asked if he knew what I could do to get a ride for my son. Without pausing, he dropped everything and went to the hospital and picked him up and took him back to his motel.

When we are at a loss, and have no blood relations in an area, we are reminded that we do have Family everywhere, the Lions Family!!

Thank you, DG Ed for taking care of my son!!! I will never forget it!






NMLDAP Supports Santa Fe Public Schools Diabetes Club

108 people were fed a Christmas dinner and there was plenty of food left for their pantry.



New Method of Applying for LCI Insurance Certificate

As you probably know, when a Club has a fundraising or community service event at a location that requires proof of insurance, you can apply for that insurance certificate from LCI. The process recently changed. If you are not aware of the change, following are the steps for the new procedure.

- 1. Go to the www.lionsclubs.org website.
- Click on "Resources For Members" at the top of the screen. On the dropdown menu click on "Resource Center."
- 3. In the Keyword Search box, enter "Insurance" and tap the Search button.
- 4. On the resources that show, click on "View" for the "Certificate of Insurance Request Form - US" and the form (as shown below) should download. You may have to click on Open File in the Downloads window.
- 5. Print out the form and fill in the required information for your event.
- 6. Do one of the following:

All applications for assistance should be returned to the Central Office in Las Cruces for processing if your club does not have the financial means to help them.

For eyeglasses only requests, if your club has the Changing Life Through Lenses sample frame kit we will contact you after processing each of your referrals applications with the next step in the process for you to help your referral.

If your club does not have the frames kit we will either arrange to send a loaner frames kit to you/your club that will need to be mailed back to the Central Office when the selection has been made. Then you can set up a meeting with your referral for them to choose their frames or we can email frames pictures to your referral to choose their frame by picture alone.

RECYCLING - The Center checks hearing aids first to see if they can be cleaned and used as loaners to clients waiting for hearing aids. If not, they are sent to a company named Starkey who saves parts for requested repairs.

HEARING AID BANK - The Albuquerque Speech Language and Hearing Center 's Hearing Aid Bank (HAB) is designed to assist people with limited resources to obtain entry level digital hearing aids at a reduced cost. The program is made possible, in part, by funding from United Way of New Mexico and is available to anyone in the State, not just Albuquerque. They received \$41,000 from United Way in 2012-2013.

(Capital City Lions have made a referral to a low income Santa Fean. She is calling the Center for an application form. She will also submit an application to our club using our eye exam and glasses form and will keep us informed as to her success.)
