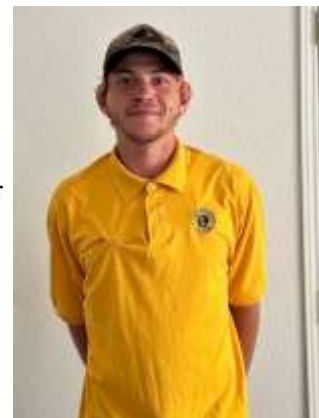
I thank the Vendor Coordinator, Dylan for all his hard work. And all our members for all the little things that are done.

Lions on the Rose Bowl Parade Float!!!! Isn't that amazing?

Now come the questions. How do we choose which Lion gets to go? The recommendation has been made that each individual club submit one name to the District Governors before the Council Meeting in November. All those names will be put in a hat and the winner will be drawn at that time. Now how does one get their name in the pot?

Well that is pretty much up to each individual club as to how they choose the lucky participant. Again, the suggestion has been made that the clubs do a 50/50 drawing to raise money for the club and the winner gets their name in the pot in November. My suggestion (remember this is only a SUGGESTION) is that, Gallup for example, have a 50/50 drawing each meeting (both board and dinner) and the lucky winner each week goes into the pot and then the last meeting in October we draw the one that is going to get the chance at the Council Meeting in November. This raises more money for the club and gives more Lions the opportunity to have a shot at it.

I have several questions regarding the Rose Bowl Parade and Float. As you know, one of our Lions has donated a spot on the float and we need additional information to get them there, cover their flights etc.

1. When do you suggest they arrive and when should they check out of the hotel?
2. Is there a specific hotel we need to make reservations at and how soon does that need to be done?
3. I understand there is a spot in the Grandstands for a partner. What is the cost, etc. of this process and how do we get that reserved?
4. Are their meals included in anything or do we cover all those expenses?

We are trying to figure out how much we need to raise to help them with this trip so your information would be greatly appreciated.

Thanks!!! Hope you and Lion Amy had a good time while in Gallup - it is certainly going to be a memorable Convention for me!!!! Thank you again for your time and support of our Multi District.

Thank you for your inquiry. I am anxious to distribute information for the 2024 Rose Parade, however the details are still being determined. However, I can answer some questions based on the consistent plans and schedule we have been using the past few years.

The International President typically arrives 3-4 days before the parade. We will plan on IP Patty Hill arriving by Friday, December 29. The IP and most Lions will be staying at the DoubleTree Hotel in Rosemead, CA. All functions and gatherings will be held at the DoubleTree. There is a Lions Reception of 200 attendees that will be held at the hotel. I have attached last year's flyer.

1. When do you suggest they arrive and when should they check out of the hotel? **No later than Saturday, Dec. 30. Many like to see the float prior to completion - Saturday is the final day of decorating. Sunday morning is Float Judging. Those riding the floats must attend. Float riders are provided exclusive transportation to and from the Float Barn.**
2. Is there a specific hotel we need to make reservations at and how soon does that need to be done? **The DoubleTree Hotel - Los Angeles-Rosemead**
3. I understand there is a spot in the Grandstands for a partner. What is the cost, etc. of this process and how do we get that reserved? **The Float Rider's Guest is provided a complimentary grandstand seat valued at \$125.**
4. Are their meals included in anything or do we cover all those expenses? **There are no meals included.**

In addition, the following is provided to the Float Rider:

1 (one) seat on the Lions Clubs International Float

Themed apparel for the ride.

1 (one) nights accommodations at the host hotel.

1 (one) grandstand parade ticket for a guest.

2 (two) tickets to the Lions Club International President meet and greet Reception.

Tour of the float barn

Transportation to and from the parade from the host hotel.

More information will be distributed as confirmed in the coming months.

New Method of Applying for LCI Insurance Certificate

As you probably know, when a Club has a fundraising or community service event at a location that requires proof of insurance, you can apply for that insurance certificate from LCI. The process recently changed. If you are not aware of the change, following are the steps for the new procedure.

1. Go to the www.lionsclubs.org website.
2. Click on "Resources For Members" at the top of the screen. On the dropdown menu click on "Resource Center."
3. In the Keyword Search box, enter "Insurance" and tap the Search button.
4. On the resources that show, click on "View" for the "Certificate of Insurance Request Form - US" and the form (as shown below) should download. You may have to click on Open File in the Downloads window.
5. Print out the form and fill in the required information for your event.
6. Do one of the following:

If your club does not have the frames kit we will either arrange to send a loaner frames kit to you/your club that will need to be mailed back to the Central Office when the selection has been made. Then you can set up a meeting with your referral for them to choose their frames or we can email frames pictures to your referral to choose their frame by picture alone.

DIRECTOR TAMMY LITTS IS AVAILABLE TO SPEAK AT MEETINGS AND PROVIDE INFORMATION ABOUT THE CENTER LOCATED AT 9500 MONTGOMERY BLVD, NE SUITE 215. SHE CAN BE REACHED AT 505-247-4224. She worked with Lion Ellie and the Transitional Leos in the past.

RECYCLING - The Center checks hearing aids first to see if they can be cleaned and used as loaners to clients waiting for hearing aids. If not, they are sent to a company named Starkey who saves parts for requested repairs.

HEARING AID BANK - The Albuquerque Speech Language and Hearing Center 's Hearing Aid Bank (HAB) is designed to assist people with limited resources to obtain entry level digital hearing aids at a reduced cost. The program is made possible, in part, by funding from United Way of New Mexico and is available to anyone in the State, not just Albuquerque. They received \$41,000 from United Way in 2012-2013.

(Capital City Lions have made a referral to a low income Santa Fean. She is calling the Center for an application form. She will also submit an application to our club using our eye exam and glasses form and will keep us informed as to her success.)
